Child Labor Laws - Wisconsin

This is only a summary and does not contain all information pertaining to child labor laws. Information for this summary is taken from the Wisconsin Department of Workforce Development. All employers in the state are covered by state law and some are also covered by federal law. For employers covered by both state and federal requirements, the law that is more strict prevails.

Parent-Owned Business

Children 12 years of age or older are permitted to work at any gainful occupation under the direct supervision of their parent or guardian in connection with the parent's or guardian's business, trade, or profession, provided the employment or place of employment is not deemed hazardous.

PERMIT?

Yes. Permits are required for employment of minors under 18 years of age.

HOURS

- Minors under 18 may not be employed during the hours they are required to attend school.
- Student learners may be allowed to work during school hours if the student is enrolled in a work-based learning program.
- Minors who are high school graduates can work the same hours as adults.
- Wisconsin no longer limits the hours 16-17 year-old minors may work.
- See the DWD Child Labor website for current applicable hours and times of the day that minors under 16 may work in Wisconsin.

TYPE OF WORK FOR MINORS

Depending on the age of the minor, they may and may not be allowed to perform certain duties. The chart below provides some examples. For a complete detailed list, visit the Wisconsin Department of Workforce Development website noted above.

 Pressing or punching machines (punch press, plate punches, power press, etc;) 	16 and over—only machines that are equipped with automatic feed and ejection and with a fixed barrier to prevent hands or fingers of the operator from entering the area between the dies; power presses; and plate punches All else prohibited to all minors
Shearing machines (guillotine, rotary shears, etc.)	Prohibited to all minors
